MAY AAPI MONTH HISTORY

1977 - Began With The Idea
Originated in the year of 1979, started by introducing House Joint Resolution 540 which would be the first 10 days of May, then Hawaii Senator Daniel Inouye proposed a similar idea which enforced, which either of them were not pass

1978 - A Push For AAPI
Representative Horton introduced the idea House Joint Resolution 1007, which was the first 10 days of May

1978 - Passed
Approved by the House and the Senate, which Jimmy Carter signed the Public Law 95-419 on Oct. 5, 1978

1980-1990 - Time Goes On
The decade long appreciation had been a week long, which would soon change

1990 - Turned In A Month
Congress approved of the expansion of a week to a month

1992 - Week --> Month
George H. W. Bush passed the Public Law 102- 450, of renaming the month to shorten the title
